
## GRAND KNIGHT'S MESSAGE

**Father Ernie Deslippe** (1929 - 2011) served as Council chaplain for over 46 years. He was born in Harrow Ontario on March 20, 1929 and was ordained to the priesthood by Bishop John C. Cody on May 27, 1961 at St. Peter's Basilica, London Ontario. He celebrated his first Mass at St. Anthony of Padua parish in Harrow. Through his 50 years of ordained ministry, he served as associate pastor, Holy Angels' Parish, St. Thomas; and Administrator, St. Joseph Mission, Port Stanley. He was an inspiring priest, a leader with fortitude. Throughout his life he was a comforting power for disadvantaged people helping them to find a clear path to follow. He was a dedicated member of the Knights of Columbus who stressed that prayer is a vital tool. It helps to become confident, to see things in proper perspective, to give us vision, courage, strength and endurance, and to erode our impure motives.

He said holiness is not something we do for ourselves and instead something that God does in us. He invited us to open our hands to allow what we have to be shared, to flow out of us and we watch it multiplied. He understood that giving, not getting, is the generosity begets generosity. He pointed out that paying attention is one of the greatest compliments we can pay to another human being. Father Deslippe exemplified the mission of the Church to guide its followers to a fulfilling life. He was a great spiritual leader dedicated to prayer and always striving for virtue. Fr. Ernie was a strong advocate of learning and so Council awards a \$1000 scholarship in his name each year to a student that demonstrates the values and principles of the Gospel and is pursuing post-secondary education.

The Knights of Columbus (K of C) is a fraternal benefit society that was established in 1882 thanks to the efforts of **Blessed Father Michael J. McGivney**, assistant pastor of St. Mary's Church in New Haven, Connecticut. # BISHOP FABBRO'S CHRISTMAS MESSAGE ... 2011:

[ed.: I found this while browsing the web for an appropriate seasonal message ... It's over a decade old but I think you'll agree the themes still resonant today. I also think it's a nice complement to Brother Rob Weir's article in this issue. Enjoy!]

Every year, I am always amazed that Christmas is still able to inspire us. Christmas touches our hearts and brings out the best in us. It is at Christmas that the poor, the homeless, those who are dependent on food banks, those who suffer from mental illnesses -- those who are usually invisible to us - become visible. We become aware of them, and aware of their needs. We want to do something for them. At this time of year, I see so many people, so many churches and so many organizations reaching out to those in need.

At Christmas, Christians celebrate the birth of our Saviour. The Word of God takes on our human nature. God takes on the weakness and frailty of our human condition. Jesus was born of Mary; he came to us as an infant under very humble circumstances. Jesus grew up and lived among us. Jesus showed us that God cares for us, especially when we are in need. Jesus showed us that God cares for the poor, the sick, the lonely, and the suffering. For us Christians, the Christmas message is that FAITH in Jesus changes us. As we draw closer to Jesus, we begin to see the world as he does and we begin to think and feel and act as he would. We know that the poor and the needy are important to Jesus. The same is true of us, his followers -- the poor and needy are important to us.

The mystery of the Incarnation is that God came down from heaven to become one with us. God came to be with us in our human struggles. But that is only the beginning. God took on our human nature to give us a share in his own divine nature. His grace forgives our sins, but it also transforms us and makes us entirely new. With his grace, we become children of God. At Christmas, we celebrate the birth of Jesus. We also celebrate our own birth into this new life. **It is faith that opens us to this wonderful transformation. Faith opens us to the power of God's grace. It enables us to become more like Christ.** Christmas is a special time, a time to be with family and friends. At Christmas, many people will come to church. I invite everyone to join us in our churches and experience the wonder and awe as we celebrate the birth of our Saviour.

I extend my heartfelt wishes for a blessed Christmas to you. May you experience the joy and peace that our Saviour brings us.

# Peace on Earth, Goodwill to All Men

This Christmas it has fallen to my wife and I to host Christmas dinner.



Every year we take turns to have everyone over for a big turkey dinner. This year, Linda and I get to do double duty as we're having her brother and wife, and their two children and their spouses over on Christmas day. Then, on Boxing Day my one remaining brother and one remaining sister and their spouses, as well as my nephew with his wife and children ... a full house both days. I've already started planning on dinner and desserts, etc. All of this planning and getting the house in order makes me regret I haven't thought much about the real meaning behind this impending celebration. Given all of the hustle and bustle, it's easy for the birth of Christ to get lost in our hectic lives. I'm sure we all have our own methods of keeping the true meaning of Christmas in our hearts and minds. I'll share with you some points in history where December 25<sup>th</sup> saw mankind embrace the true meaning of God's love and bring forth (or at least try) change.

In 1915, the First World War had been raging for a year. Everyone on both sides had thought they'd be back home by then but were instead locked in a stalemate, only yards away from where they had begun in 1914. The men on both sides had been living in trenches full of muck, mud, blood, rats and vermin for almost a year and already the world had lost 6 million souls both military and civilian. The average soldier on either side wouldn't have been able to locate Sarajevo on a map and likely never heard of the Arch Duke and his wife whose assassinations had sparked the war. It's not that the average '*Tommy*' hated the opposing '*Fritz*' and yet they'd grown very accustomed to killing one another. As I've told you before, they set aside their human emotions and became automaton zombie killers and only on account of an officer's order. When December 25th came to the trenches of the *British Expeditionary Force* (BEF) and the *Canadian Expeditionary Force* (CEF), the men desired to create a Christmas feast of their own. They pooled their resources (everyone had care parcels from home) as the Canadians shared homemade strawberry jam or maple syrup with their British mates in exchange for Kippers (yuk). Men who had an extra pair of knitted socks gave a pair to those who did not. It always seemed that some Canadian had a harmonica and some Brit had a squeezebox and so combined they would play tunes that the other men sang along to and often enough made men laugh as the lyrics of wartime songs were very racy. As the men of the Dominion sat down to enjoy their meal and their tot of rum, they heard something no one had heard in a year: silence; no guns, no bombs, no men crying out for their mothers, just quiet. What a gift this seemed. Then, through the silence, came the sound of *Silent Night*, being sung in the language it was written in, as their German enemy had also been celebrating Christmas complete with an evergreen tree propped on the edge of their trench. They'd been enjoying their extra ration of schnapps. When they finished, the English in return sang *I Saw Three Ships* followed by a group of Scots singing *Auld Lang Syne*. A lone German soldier bravely stood up in no man's land and held out a loaf of pumpernickel bread to the men in the opposing trench. A man on our side stood up to accept the offer and before long men on both sides were up and shaking hands with each other, exchanging uniform buttons and cap badges, and rum for schnapps. A football (soccer ball) appeared and a game broke out as laughing and singing continued. The sounds of life had replaced the sounds of death. While all of this happened spontaneously, it wasn't too long sadly before officers on both sides got wind of what was going on and came and put an end to it. After all, where would they be if the men became friends with one another? It's very difficult to wage a war when the men refuse to kill each other. What other power than God's love could have inspired this event? **God sent His son Jesus to be born among us out of love and on Christmas Day in 1915 His love shone brightly in the hearts of those British, Canadian and German soldiers.** Because of the day, they put down their guns and offered each other friendship and love of their fellow man. The men who took part in that Christmas day armistice would speak of it well into their old age and when they did a smile would come across their face and tears would show in their eyes. Could that event be repeated today should Russian and Ukrainian soldiers set down their guns to celebrate the birth of Christ together? I think not, even while both countries profess to be either Eastern Orthodox or followers of the Latin Church, not enough of those involved truly believe in our Savior. Both leaders will bend a knee and receive the Eucharist when the cameras are rolling, but in my mind it's a photo op. I won't even mention the war that rages where Christ once walked and preached his message of love, where today his teachings are trampled underfoot in the Holy Land.

Now, I'm going to take you way back in time, to the 5<sup>th</sup> century when the known world was teetering between paganism and Christianity. The Franks were a tribe of people that covered present day Germany, France, south into the Italian peninsula and as far north as Switzerland. The Franks were ruled by a man named *Clovis*, a devout pagan who worshiped Jupiter and Mercury. He was married to a Burgundian princess named *Clotilde*, a follower of the Latin church-Catholic. Clotilde held incredible sway over her husband and while she constantly begged him to convert, he held out waiting to be convinced of her god's power. She told him that Jesus wasn't about power but instead professed love, peace and kindness; not things that 5th century rulers held in high regard when focused on war and conquest. To cut a long story short: Clovis, on the eve of an upcoming battle at a place called *Tolbiac*, prayed to Jesus to allow him to vanquish his foe. In the morning, the Franks crushed their enemy which convinced Clovis of the power of his wife's god and on December 25<sup>th</sup> in the year 508, Clovis, king of the Franks, was baptized into the Catholic faith.

What's Clovis' conversion got to do with us today? You may think nothing on account that Clovis's conversion was misguided ('paganistic') and you're probably correct. Nevertheless, his baptism did achieve something that changed the course of history since, if he didn't, the chances are you wouldn't be reading this as a Catholic. You see, in those days when a king changed his religion his entire court followed suit in order to stay in his 'good books'. As such, every prince, duke, baron or other noble sought to become baptized and that called for catechists and priests to come into the lands of the Franks to offer instruction and bestow the sacrament. This further required churches to be built. A 'chain reaction' of sorts therefore followed Clovis' conversion and like the ripples in a pond, it spread. While a lot of the early converts probably held onto their old beliefs, their children became true believers and their children even more so, and so on and so on, until you had places like Reims and Notre Dame being built in the land of the Franks, the culmination of a ripple started on a Christmas day.

Throughout history many other rulers chose Christmas day to be the day of baptism and conversion, including the great **Charlemagne** in 800 and **William the Conqueror** in 1066 (both chose Christmas as the day to be crowned as rulers of their nations). These men of war and violence saw the importance of the day and bent their knees to the small child born in a manger in Bethlehem. I hope you can see that these tales I've told you show that the power of the love of Christ can overcome the biggest obstacles this world can throw in its way. Surely, the day that God chose to send His love to earth, with the birth of His Son, can overcome the problems this modern world can put in our way.

The true meaning of Christmas can overcome the demands of family and the commercialization of Christmas. It can likewise overcome, even flourish, in a society that refuses the teachings of Jesus and prohibits His presence in its schools. Christ's love and the true meaning of Christmas can overcome all of this and so much more, but it's going to take us to make sure it does. We need to say '**Merry Christmas**' to people we meet. We can ensure the presence of Christ in our homes when family comes to visit (I'm sure I'm not the only one who, as a Catholic, is a minority in his own family). We can show our love of our neighbors and fellow man even when it's hard to do. While there's a lot of very needy people out in our community, remember '**talk is cheap**' and '**actions speak louder than words**'. There are people who are lonely and Christmas time often intensifies that loneliness so let's all visit one person who is alone or invite them into your home for Christmas with your family. What a great way to express our belief that Christ came into this world to bring joy into it and replace hatred with true love. Let's spread the joy of Christ's birth wherever we go! I wish you all a very Merry Christmas and a happy and healthy new year. Let's not forget Peace; pray for peace.

# Reflection

The Catechism of the Catholic Church explains that *When the Church celebrates the liturgy of Advent each year, she makes present this ancient expectancy of the Messiah, for by sharing in the long preparation for the Saviour's first coming, the faithful renew their ardent desire for his second coming. By celebrating the precursor's birth and martyrdom, the Church unites herself to his desire: "He must increase, but I must decrease."* (CCC 524)

In so doing, it clarifies the dual purpose of our Advent observations: to prepare ourselves to celebrate Jesus' birth (His first coming), and to renew our faith for His second. The secular world facilitates our preparation, at least that of our children, by producing calendars that reward their daily preparations with chocolates or other treats. While one supposes an appropriate advent calendar for adults would reveal a daily reading, they don't seem to be stocked at local stores. But, and in lieu of a calendar bestowing daily chocolates, we have the **Advent Wreath** to mark time. Here follows a brief refresher on its significance.<sup>1</sup>

The circular shape of the wreath, without beginning or end, symbolizes God's complete and unending love for us. It also represents eternal life which becomes ours through faith in Jesus Christ. The Advent Wreath traditionally holds four candles which are lit, one at a time, on each of the four Sundays of the Advent season. Each candle represents 1,000 years that symbolize the 4,000 years that humanity waited for the world's Savior, from Adam and Eve to Jesus as foretold in the Old Testament.

Violet is a liturgical color that signifies a time of prayer, penance, and sacrifice and is used during Advent and Lent. Advent ('little Lent') is the season where we spiritually wait in our darkness with hopeful expectation for our promised redemption, just as the whole world did before Christ's birth (and now as we await his promised return).<sup>2</sup>

During the first two weeks of Advent, we light the first two purple candles. On the 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday, **Gaudete** (Rejoice) Sunday, we celebrate that our waiting for the birth of Jesus on Christmas day is almost over. Rose is a liturgical color that is used to signify joy, so we light the single pink candle at this time. Then, on the 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday, the final purple candle is lit to mark the final week of prayer and penance as we wait for the soon-coming birth of the King of Kings. Traditionally, each of the four Advent candles have a deeper meaning:

- The 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday's **Prophet's candle** symbolizes **Hope** reminding us that Jesus is coming.
- The 2<sup>nd</sup>'s **Bethlehem candle** symbolizes **Faith** reminding us of Mary and Joseph's journey to Bethlehem.
- The 3<sup>rd</sup>'s **Shepherd's candle** symbolizes **Joy**, the Joy the world experienced at the coming birth of Jesus.
- The 4<sup>th</sup>'s **Angel's candle** symbolizes **Peace**. Its message? "**Peace on Earth, Good Will Toward Men.**"

So, dust off and set up your Advent Wreath and then **reflect each Sunday on what each candle symbolizes as you stare into its flame**. Just make sure to keep it a safe distance from all other flammable items in your home ... and best to change the batteries in your smoke alarm before you start and become entranced in prayer by the candles' flickering lights.

Websters dictionary defines it as something that is believed, especially with strong conviction, and also, a firm belief in something when there is no proof to support it. I have been a part of the current **Steppingstones** (The Search faith program through our family of parishes). A recent session featured a film and the follow up discussion was about faith and what that looked like to us. At the end of the film, the narrator challenged us: Did we lack the faith to ask God to reveal Himself to us, and, if not and we had even a spark of faith, did we want it to grow so as to ask God to reveal Himself more?

For the next few days, I prayed each evening for God to reveal Himself to me more; to show me my purpose and what I was to do. It did not take long to see God and grow my faith. On the Saturday, only a few days after the session, my family's world was turned upside down. My wife was diagnosed at STEGH ER with a brain tumour. Later that evening, while waiting to be transferred to University Hospital neurology ICU, I was on my way back inside from the parking lot when I met Father John at the front doors. I explained why Lisa was there and asked if he could give Lisa the sacrament of the sick to which he said "Absolutely". When Father John was finished, he came out and shook my hand saying, "**Lisa is in God's hands now and there are no better hands to be in.**" Upon hearing that, I saw the face of God and felt a calm come over me. All I needed, or rather all I could do in this situation, was to have faith.

A few days later was surgery day and between Saturday and Wednesday I prayed ...a lot. And so did everyone else that I knew. Word had spread and so many prayers and rosaries were said. My wife came through surgery remarkably better than expected and was home just 48 hrs post-op! While we have a long road ahead of us (this is only step one), we have faith and the faith of amazing friends and family.

I continue to pray the rosary and ask God to continue to reveal himself to me. We have to have faith! It's all we have in a chaotic world. The path to order is clear if we pray and ask God to reveal Himself to us. In closing I would like to express our sincere thanks to all my Brother Knights and fellow parishioners for their prayers and support. It has revealed God's face and faith to us. Keep praying for Lisa and my family and please don't be afraid to ask for prayers if you are in need. As Father John said, "**There are no better hands**". Ask God to reveal Himself to you and you will be amazed in the growth of faith in your own life. God Bless!
