## GRAND KNIGHT'S MESSAGE


### Brothers:

**Father Ernie Deslippe** (1929 - 2011) served as Council chaplain for over 46 years. He was born in Harrow Ontario on March 20, 1929 and was ordained to the priesthood by Bishop John C. Cody on May 27, 1961 at St. Peter's Basilica, London Ontario. He celebrated his first Mass at St. Anthony of Padua parish in Harrow. Through his 50 years of ordained ministry, he served as associate pastor, Holy Angels' Parish, St. Thomas; and Administrator, St. Joseph Mission, Port Stanley. He was an inspiring priest, a leader with fortitude. Throughout his life he was a comforting power for disadvantaged people helping them to find a clear path to follow. He was a dedicated member of the Knights of Columbus who stressed that prayer is a vital tool. It helps to become confident, to see things in proper perspective, to give us vision, courage, strength and endurance, and to erode our impure motives.

He said holiness is not something we do for ourselves and instead something that God does in us. He invited us to open our hands to allow what we have to be shared, to flow out of us and we watch it multiplied. He understood that giving, not getting, is the generosity begets generosity. He pointed out that paying attention is one of the greatest compliments we can pay to another human being. Father Deslippe exemplified the mission of the Church to guide its followers to a fulfilling life. He was a great spiritual leader dedicated to prayer and always striving for virtue. Fr. Ernie was a strong advocate of learning and so Council awards a \$1000 scholarship in his name each year to a student that demonstrates the values and principles of the Gospel and is pursuing post-secondary education.

The Knights of Columbus (K of C) is a fraternal benefit society that was established in 1882 thanks to the efforts of **Blessed Father Michael J. McGivney**, assistant pastor of St. Mary's Church in New Haven, Connecticut. The K of C has grown from several members in one council to more than 14,000 councils and approaching 2 million members world-wide. 

# Lent and how to transform our lives through it

Lent is a sacred season in the Catholic Church, lasting 40 days, during which we prepare for Easter through prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. For Catholic men, this period offers a unique opportunity to deepen our faith, strengthen our relationship with God, and reflect on our lives. By engaging in meaningful practices and adopting a spirit of humility and repentance, we can make this Lent a transformative experience.



**Embrace Prayer** - Prayer is the cornerstone of a fruitful Lent. ## Holy Angels Restoration Update

Last year, I sat at a Knights of Columbus business meeting with a visiting knight from a neighboring Council beside me listening to a report on the situation at Holy Angels. At that time, we heard that **\$500,000** was still owed on the debt incurred to do the renovations and repairs needed on our Talbot Street church. The visiting knight gasped at the fact that half a million dollars was still owed. After the meeting, he shared with me his solution which was to sell the church and be done with it. I did my best to control my temper and calmly walked away. Later, after collecting myself and taking a deep breath, I told him that Holy Angels is more than just a church, it is the spiritual home of many and has been for many generations. I continued to say that the debt would indeed be paid off because I had faith.

Well, we can now jump forward from that exchange to a time two months ago when the debt had decreased to **\$250,000**. Soon thereafter to **\$150,000**, and as I write this it stands at **\$130,000**. What an incredible example of faith in action!

Many people love Holy Angels and consider it their spiritual home. They are clearly willing to step up to the plate to get rid of the debt so we can then move forward and start raising funds to start repairs like the front steps. I will plan to provide you further updates as the fundraising campaign progresses.

# Reflection

Are you feeling helpless these days? Like you're trapped in the back seat of a vehicle called 'current world affairs' that is hell-bent on accelerating towards a granite wall? If so, you're not alone, my friend, and while misery does indeed love company, perhaps now is a good time to reflect on who tries to rules the world and why we must be vigilant in resisting him.

I hear you, "We have a world ruler?!" Apparently yes, and I was recently surprised to learn it's the devil. "How so?", you ask. Well, it came to me upon reflecting on Luke's description of the temptation of Jesus in the desert (4:5-7), soon after Jesus' baptism at the beginning of His earthly mission, "**And the devil took him up, and showed him all the kingdoms of the world in a moment of time, and said to him, "To you I will give all this authority and their glory; for it has been delivered to me, and I give it to whom I will. If you, then, will worship me, it shall all be yours."**"

I also found recognition of the devil as world ruler in "**The Promise of the Holy Spirit**" (John 14:15-31) at the end of Jesus' time with us, wherein He states, "**These things I have spoken to you, while I am still with you. But the Counselor, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, he will teach you all things, and bring to your remembrance all that I have said to you. Peace, I leave with you; my peace, I give to you; not as the world gives do I give to you. Let not your hearts be troubled, neither let them be afraid. You heard me say to you, 'I go away, and I will come to you.' If you loved me, you would have rejoiced, because I go to the Father; for the Father is greater than I. And now I have told you before it takes place, so that when it does take place, you may believe. I will no longer talk much with you, for the ruler of this world is coming. He has no power over me; but I do as the Father has commanded me, so that the world may know that I love the Father.**"

If my reading of the gospels is not wrong, what should we make of the above passages? On the one hand, we may concede the history of human misery seems to give credence to the devil having bestowed authority and infamy (if not 'glory') to world leaders that are, and have been, aligned with his 'values'. Many names surely come to mind, from Caligula (Roman emperor from AD 37 until his assassination in AD 41) through to our modern age. On the other hand, even if Jesus apparently foretold the arrival of the devil as ruler of the world, He did so while also promising His Father would send us the Holy Spirit to help us focus on complying with His essential commandments: **Love God and love your neighbour as yourself**. Moreover, He saw to it that we would be equipped with no less than the graces of **faith, hope** and **charity** ... powerful armor against the forces of evil while we exist on earth under the influence of whomever the devil elevates.

And yet, we must wait, even as we may daily petition God with "**Thy Kingdom come, Thy will be done on earth as it is in Heaven**" to intercede against the havoc wreaked by the devil through those he favours. While we wait, however, we may also draw comfort from St. Paul's message to the church at Philippi (Philippians 3:18-21), "**For many, of whom I have often told you and now tell you even with tears, live as enemies of the cross of Christ. Their end is destruction, their god is the belly, and they glory in their shame, with minds set on earthly things. But our commonwealth is in heaven, and from it we await a Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ, who will change our lowly body to be like his glorious body, by the power which enables him even to subject all things to himself.**" '**Elbows Up!**', while we wait indeed.

So, let us persevere despite the malice and evil that consumes those world leaders and oligarchs bent on infamy. Let us also heed St. Paul's advice to the Thessalonians (5:2-11), "**For you yourselves know well that the day of the Lord will come like a thief in the night. When people say, "There is peace and security," then sudden destruction will come upon them as travail comes upon a woman with child, and there will be no escape. But you are not in darkness, brethren, for that day to surprise you like a thief. For you are all sons of light and sons of the day; we are not of the night or of darkness. So then let us not sleep, as others do, but let us keep awake and be sober. For those who sleep, sleep at night; and those who get drunk are drunk at night. But, since we belong to the day, let us be sober, and put on the breastplate of faith and love, and for a helmet the hope of salvation. For God has not destined us for wrath, but to obtain salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ, who died for us so that whether we wake or sleep we might live with him. Therefore encourage one another and build one another up, just as you are doing.**"

As a Knight, **you** are numbered among the **sons of light**. Together with your fellow brothers, it is your mission to bring the light and peace to others.

# Catholic Corner

How's your Lenten season going? I am not here to judge, as there is only one judge, but instead to reflect on my own and ask you to do the same. Lent, as we know, is a time of prayer, fasting (abstinence – no meat on Fridays), and alms giving. Personally, my Lent began well, as I was more prayerful and more deliberate in my prayer time. While I gave up time on social media, I did take the time to send a daily message to a friend or family member to let them know how much they mean to me. I also visited neighbours, to reconnect after this long winter of hibernation, and also dropped in on a 'shut-in'. So, while the first week and half was great, I have stalled lately. That's okay, however, and I'm convinced there's need to give up. I just need to get back to more deliberate prayer and giving of my time to others.



Prayer is, for me, a huge deal as I have experienced firsthand the power of prayer. Recently, during a session of the RCIA program of which I am a sponsor, we learned about our Mother, Mary. It was revealed that Mary was given to us by Jesus as He was expiring on the cross when he instructed John, the disciple that He loved, "**Behold, this is your Mother and Woman, behold your son**" (John 19:26-27). Jesus wasn't just giving his Mother to John but to the church and, by extension, to each one of us. Wow, what a beautiful gift!

Mary is our Mother, as she remains the Mother of God, Jesus Christ. She is seated at the right hand of Jesus where she intercedes for our prayers. When we recite a **Hail Mary**, we ask her to "**pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death**". 
