## GRAND KNIGHT'S MESSAGE



**Brothers:** For my **Christmas** message to you, I 'gift' to you the words of **St. Paul** (Romans 12):

*I appeal to you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship. Do not be conformed to this world but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that you may prove what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect. For by the grace given to me I bid every one among you not to think of himself more highly than he ought to think, but to think with sober judgment, each according to the measure of faith which God has assigned him. For as in one body, we have many members, and all the members do not have the same function, so we, though many, are one body in Christ, and individually members one of another. Having gifts that differ according to the grace given to us, let us use them: if prophecy, in proportion to our faith; if service, in our serving; he who teaches, in his teaching; he who exhorts, in his exhortation; he who contributes, in liberality; he who gives aid, with zeal; he who does acts of mercy, with cheerfulness.*

*Let love be genuine; hate what is evil, hold fast to what is good; love one another with brotherly affection; outdo one another in showing honor. Never flag in zeal, be aglow with the Spirit, serve the Lord. Rejoice in your hope, be patient in tribulation, be constant in prayer. Contribute to the needs of the saints, practice hospitality. Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse them. Rejoice with those who rejoice, weep with those who weep. Live in harmony with one another; do not be haughty, but associate with the lowly; never be conceited. Repay no one evil for evil, but take thought for what is noble in the sight of all. If possible, so far as it depends upon you, live peaceably with all. Beloved, never avenge yourselves, but leave it to the wrath of God; for it is written, "Vengeance is mine, I will repay, says the Lord." No, "if your enemy is hungry, feed him; if he is thirsty, give him drink; for by so doing, you will heap burning coals upon his head." Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good.*

**Father Ernie Deslippe** (1929 - 2011) served as Council chaplain for over 46 years. He was born in Harrow Ontario on March 20, 1929 and was ordained to the priesthood by Bishop John C. Cody on May 27, 1961 at St. Peter's Basilica, London Ontario. He celebrated his first Mass at St. Anthony of Padua parish in Harrow. Through his 50 years of ordained ministry, he served as associate pastor, Holy Angels' Parish, St. Thomas; and Administrator, St. Joseph Mission, Port Stanley. He was an inspiring priest, a leader with fortitude. Throughout his life he was a comforting power for disadvantaged people helping them to find a clear path to follow. He was a dedicated member of the Knights of Columbus who stressed that prayer is a vital tool. It helps to become confident, to see things in proper perspective, to give us vision, courage, strength and endurance, and to erode our impure motives. He said holiness is not something we do for ourselves and instead something that God does in us. He invited us to open our hands to allow what we have to be shared, to flow out of us and we watch it multiplied. He understood that giving, not getting, is the generosity begets generosity. He pointed out that paying attention is one of the greatest compliments we can pay to another human being. Father Deslippe exemplified the mission of the Church to guide its followers to a fulfilling life. He was a great spiritual leader dedicated to prayer and always striving for virtue. Fr. Ernie was a strong advocate of learning and so Council awards a \$1000 scholarship in his name each year to a student that demonstrates the values and principles of the Gospel and is pursuing post-secondary education.

# Living In The Eternal Love of Christ

**Brothers in Christ:** This message is not going to focus on the Commercial Christmas but instead on God's gifts to Mankind (His only Son our Lord Jesus Christ): the blessing we see in the sunrise of each new morning, our daily bread that physically nourishes our bodies, and every little thing that He provides for our spiritual nourishment including the benefit of starting each day well before the sun rises. I appreciate the blessings that God gives me and each of us through early morning prayers for our spiritual nourishment for God's guidance when planning our goals for the day ahead. Spending time alone with God in quiet worship and prayer is the key to faith and the success of a faith-based life. Let us then start every new day in prayer for the new gift that God has given us. Morning can be a time to remember God's renewing grace and faithfulness. Morning prayer, in the early hours of each new day, is the time to seek God's divine wisdom and to trust in God's direction for our lives and for His deep and unwavering love for each of us. We should also end each day with prayer. Let prayer be the final act of your day as you surrender to God's will. There is a peace that comes in ending your day in prayer that you will wake up to the New Day that God has made with your first thoughts turned to praising Him, "**But seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all things will be added to you**" (Mathew 6:33).



Many of the most successful men and women in history spent their early hours alone with God in prayer. We see it with most of the successful men of today. Charlie Kirk is said to have started his day at 3 a.m. with prayer. We saw it with the Prophets of the Old Testament. We saw it with the disciples of the new testament. Most importantly, we saw it with Jesus in His early mornings, "**And in the morning, a great while before day, he rose and went out to a lonely place, and there he prayed**" (Mark 1:35). Jesus would go to secluded places like the mountains, gardens, or wilderness to have intentional one on one time with God, free from distractions. King David also went out in the quiet of the early hours to a quiet place of prayer. These serve as examples of the importance of seeking time in the early hours to have time alone time in prayer. Many Catholics try to get to Mass early while the church is still dark and to kneel in prayer to have time alone in God's temple. Free from distractions. God's temple is a place to be quiet during early prayer; a time to recharge the spirit of the Lord in your heart. The Lord calls us to not only live in His spirit but to grow and mature in it. This is one of God's gifts we can gain from a prayerful life lived according to His and that of ourselves. "**In the early morning, O Lord, you will hear my voice**" (Psalm 5:3). Morning is the quiet at the beginning of your new day; the time to give all praise and glory to God in his righteousness. Let the early hours of the morning be the time for transition from sorrow to joy.

God calls on us to grow and mature in our faith as we grow older. While seniors can still be very effective workers of God's harvest, we should not underestimate the level of spiritual maturity in our young people. God calls many young people to be his workers. The harvest is great, but the workers are few. Young believers can do much in God's harvest fields and service to others is the best way for a young person to grow in faith. You can go into volunteering to help others and quickly learn that you are the one who benefits by growing in your own faith. We should attend as many early Masses as we can. Arrive early to have time for silent prayer. We should make regular confessions, another time for quiet time in prayer alone with the Lord. We can pray silently before receiving communion and upon listening to every word spoken by the priest in the gospel message. We can also pray silently while watching the celebrant hold the bread and wine up in his hands for the blessing. To me, Communion is the most important moment of the day. Now is the time to talk about bread, God's provision for our physical needs.

The Old Testament scripture tells us that a jar of Manna was kept as a memorial (Exodus 16:33). The Israelites consumed manna for forty years until they reached and settled land near the border of Canaan. Manna was provided daily, with the instruction to gather only what was needed for that day, except for the sixth day when a double portion was gathered for the Sabbath (Exodus 16: 4-6). God tells Moses He will rain bread from heaven, and the people should gather enough for each day to test their obedience. The Biblical account of Manna is primary in Exodus. After the Israelites left Egypt, they complained about a lack of food in the wilderness and, in response, God promised, "**I will rain bread from heaven for you**" (Exodus 16:4). The New Testament tells us, "**Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceeds from the mouth of God**" (Mathew 4:4). The Catholic Host is the unleavened bread used in Eucharist, believed to become the body of Christ after the priest's consecration during mass. It commemorates Jesus's body given as a sacrifice and receiving it is known as Holy Communion. The term host comes from the Latin **hostia** or "sacrificial victim". Any hosts left at the end of communion are stored in the

locked tabernacle. While few men would start their day without breakfast and a morning coffee, God also calls believers to be nourished by His word. As we eat every day, we should seek God every day. So, yes, nourish your body but also spend every early morning alone with our Lord in quiet prayer to nourish the spirit. Hold strong to the teachings of our faith. Faith is believing in your heart what you cannot see with your eyes. Seek eternal life where you will see with your eyes what you always believed in your heart. As a young man I was lucky enough to have been raised by parents of deep faith who taught me that I must always be ready to pray and to share my faith with others. Today, I may tap a fellow believer on the shoulder and ask if they are OK. I may share with them that I believe they need my prayer. Fellow believers must always be ready to help one another when one is in a time of need.

It is time now to talk about the hours before the sun comes up. This is an amazing time to spend time alone with the Lord. If you wake up at this hour, do not be upset. It is the hour when you have no interruptions and your mind and spirit are fresh for the New Day that the Lord has made. For many, it is the time for the deepest prayer alone with the Lord. An hour to pray and also to listen. The pre-dawn silence is the time for listening. I wake up early every morning which I believe is a sign that God has plans for me in the near future and that he is preparing me for His work. It is a time to wake up spiritually and to welcome a new day that the Lord has made. In the early morning hours, the spirit is hungry. God made you. Trust in Him to make you whole. Thank God for His blessings. It is the time to seek God's guidance for your day. The early hours are the time to believe deeper in God's powers and to trust in His will and not in our own. Choose kindness when it matters most. Share God's love. Seeds, once planted, will grow in due season. Thank God for His blessings. Again, it is time to seek God's guidance: if you are a Godly young man who may be considering the priesthood, pray and ask others to pray for you. Seek God's guidance. The Lord needs Godly young men to answer His calling.

To the young women: God gives great honor to young mothers. There is no greater amount of joy than seeing a young mother and father holding a new baby. The bible describes parenting as a duty to raise children in the 'training and instruction of the Lord' (e.g., Ephesians 6:4), teaching children about God, a righteous life and to provide for their needs. Treat children with love and compassion, similar to how God treats us, His children. The impact of early guidance is well known. And to the young men: be responsible. The world desperately needs Godly young men to be husbands and fathers. Bring your children to mass. Do not let that be only your wife's job. The man is the head of the household and must be responsible in providing and raising Godly children. So, rise early with gratitude and ready for God's purpose. Thank God for the people you love. To all: Ask God to give you a heart that will allow you to walk in a way that helps those in need. Take time to listen to their story and then be their sister or brother. We see them all around us. It's time to reach out and help them. There are many amazing caring people who already volunteer and help in our community. Thank You. The need is great and we need more workers.

When the sun rises early in the morning we see God's hand at work. This message was written in the early morning hours. All blessings come from the work that God can do through us. Our last act of each day should always be submitting our will to God in prayer. Our first act of each new day should be giving all Glory to God in His righteousness. I wish to leave you with two timely passages from the Old Testament. The first is from my favorite prophet, Micah, the sixth prophet of scripture (Micah 5:2), "**But you, O Bethlehem Eph'rathah, who are little to be among the clans of Judah, from you shall come forth for me one who is to be ruler in Israel, whose origin is from of old, from ancient days.**" The second is from the book of Isaiah (Isaiah 9:6), "**For to us a child is born, to us a son is given; and the government will be upon his shoulder, and his name will be called "Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace."**"

My January message is going to be a review on homelessness in St Thomas. I now want to wish everyone a very joyful day of celebrating the Birth of the Lord Jesus Christ and I look forward to seeing you at Midnight Mass.

# Reflection

**"And the angel said to them, "Be not afraid; for behold, I bring you good news of a great joy which will come to all the people; for to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord"** (Luke 2:10-11).



**"All the people"** ... except, one supposes, King Herod, Romans generally, the elite among Israel (Pharisees & Sadducees) ... and very likely a lot of other folks living in parts of the world faced with their own pressing matters, or worshipping a pantheon of other Gods, or otherwise just trying to get by in spite of oppressive regimes and whatever else they have to deal with [Cue: *The Four Horsemen of the Apocalypse (Conquest, War, Famine, and Death); themselves dodging disease, flood, fire, volcano and earthquake as they gallop merrily along.*] Be not afraid, indeed.

And yet, things can be (and definitely have been) worse. One may imagine what life must have been for The Chosen People, living under Roman rule, that required God's herald angels to be dispatched to cheer them up, with heavenly hosts singing on high no less. Even so, would any have wanted to trade places with their future kinfolk subjected to persecution in the Middle Ages, during late 19th century Russian pogroms, by early- to mid-20th century Nazis, or even by current antisemitic activity by individuals or as state-sponsored? I hear you: "Geez ... Take a chill pill, bro."

I suppose Jesus' words to His disciples, just before His last Passover (taken from Luke 21), have affected my current state of mind: **"And when you hear of wars and tumults, do not be terrified; for this must first take place, but the end will not be at once."** He then continued with, **"Nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom; there will be great earthquakes, and in various places famines and pestilences; and there will be terrors and great signs from heaven"** (21:9-11). And finally, **"You will be delivered up even by parents and brothers and kinsmen and friends, and some of you they will put to death; you will be hated by all for my name's sake"** (21:16-17). Not one to sugar-coat things was Our Saviour. Credit the disciples for not bailing out on Him then and there.

Neither was Jesus some sort of Galilean 'Debbie Downer'. His ominous 'reality check' speech to His disciples really ought to be viewed through the lens of His prayer for them (see: John 17) which is generally considered to be the source of the Christian principle, **"We are called to be in this world, not of it"**. It is widely held to be a guide for us as we experience our lives in a secular world, with its various and sundry "tumults", to remind us to remain true to our faith and to **"be not afraid"** while doing so. For those that took in the recent **Men's Faith Series**, you likely came away with at least this: *I'm going to die, my time on earth is intended to be dedicated to preparing to face God when He welcomes me into heaven.* Ultimately, we are called to be in this world as instruments of God's love, to give priority to serving others rather than our own self-interests, until called home.

As you know, **Advent** is the time we prepare for the birth of Jesus at Christmas and for His return at the 'Second Coming'. During this time, let us reflect on the above principle so as not to become wound up in secular priorities. Let us remember to stay true to our faith as we observe the reason for the season, namely, everything leading up to and including **Christ's Mass**. Spend some time in prayer as you spend your treasure on gifts. You'll thank me for reducing your seasonal stress brother 😊

**Faith:** As a *cradle catholic*, I was taught that the church is based on **faith**. But what does that really *mean*?

Our next meeting is on Monday, December 1<sup>st</sup>, at 7 p.m. A light snack will be provided.




